Milicia gathering on September 1944.

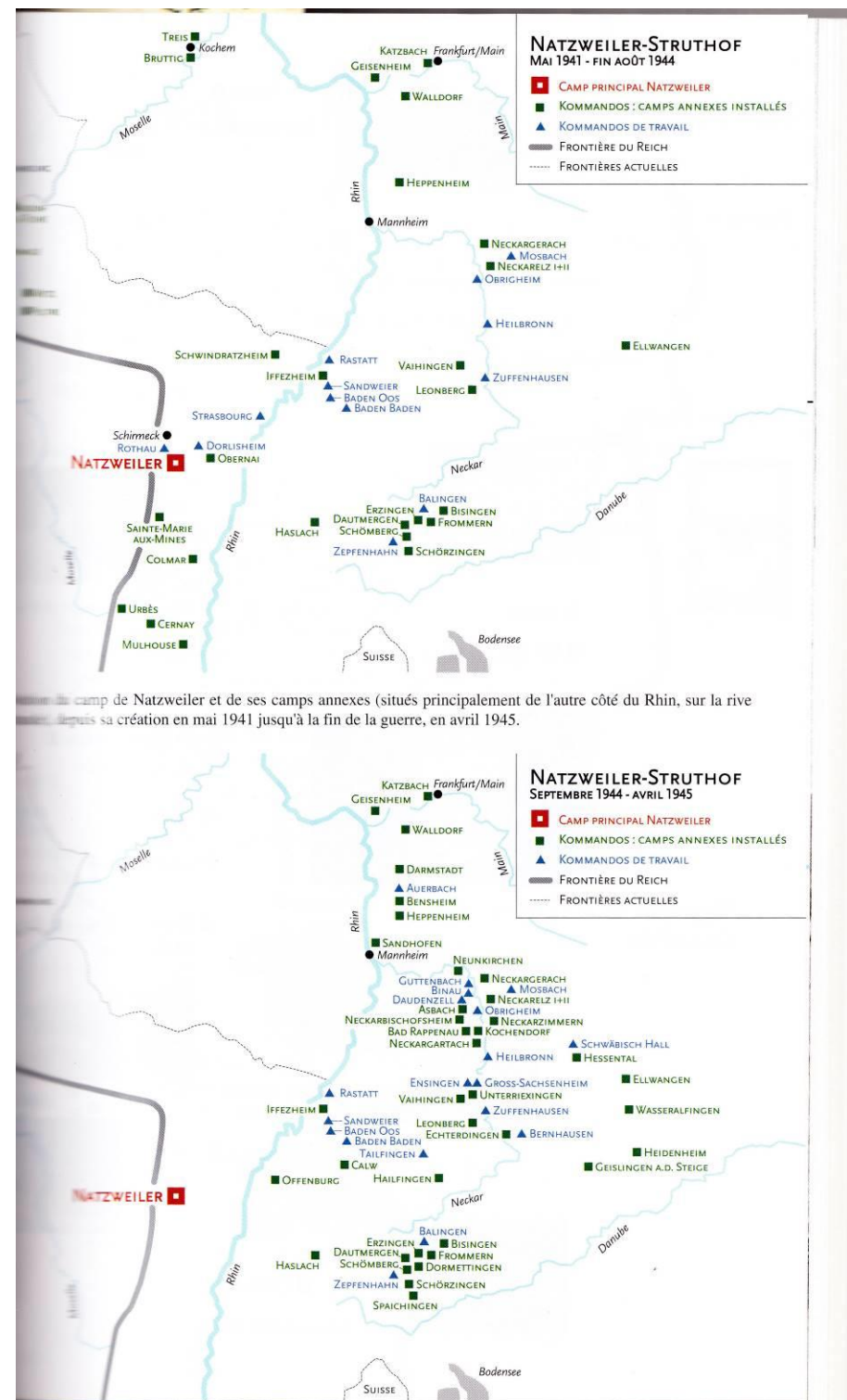
Purification camp, penitentiary center until 1949.

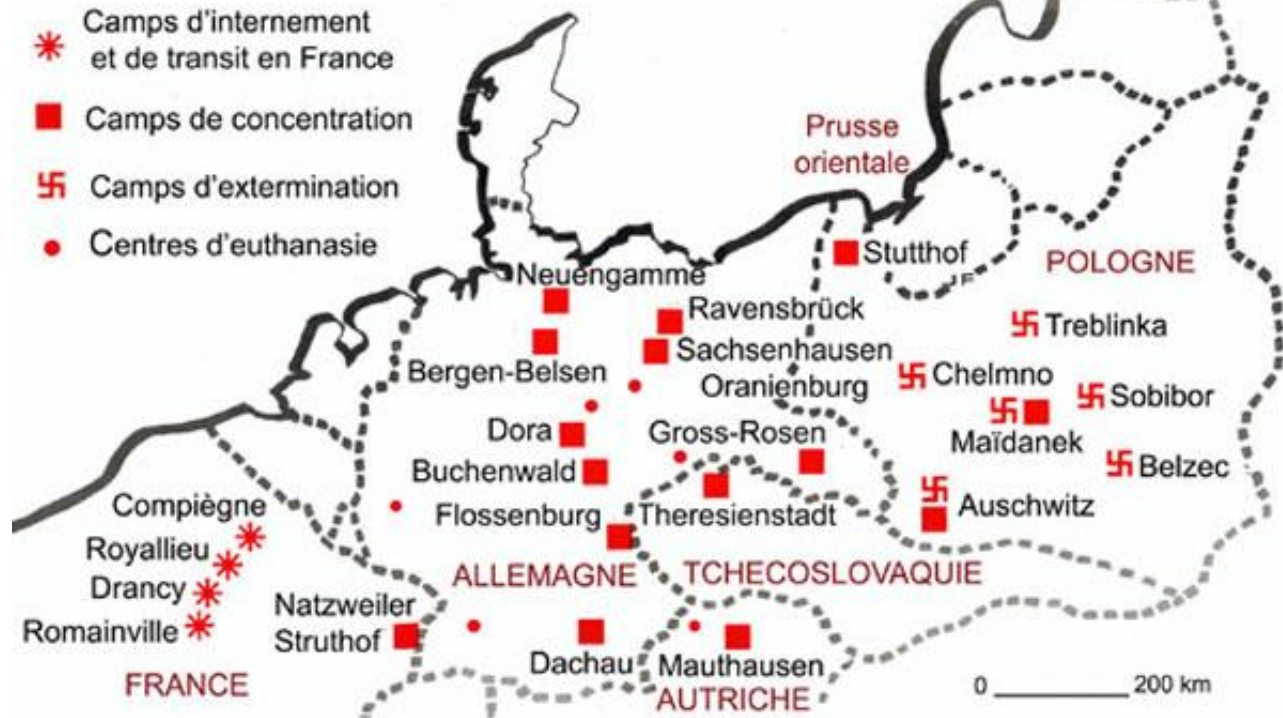
